

## // *Légère is light*

Luxembourg's latest business hotel Légère is using its modern, light and airy design to differentiate itself from its competitors. The building is designed to maximise natural light inside; an important factor in boosting alertness and a feeling of well-being. The hotel also specialises in facilities for longer-term residents, with suites up to 53 sq metre, equipped with full en-suite bathrooms and microwave/hob equipped kitchens. Room prices start at 85 euros.

This four star hotel completes the package with a restaurant seeking to provide higher quality mid-priced cuisine plus a modern, well equipped fitness and well-being centre. There are also extensive conference and group catering facilities, again with the accent on the light, modern environment. Located in the Munsbach Syrdall business park, the Légère is a handful of minutes from the airport, the Kirchberg and the city centre, all served by the hotel's shuttle bus.

It has 156 studios and suites, most being 25sq metre but with 11 at 37 sq metre and 10 53 sq metre, each with en-suite "rain showers", extra large beds and free broadband via both WiFi and ethernet. Conferences of up to 440 can be organised with catering receptions available for as many as 325 people. The Cube restaurant/bar is a spacious 400 sq metre and focuses on providing modern, refined cooking from head chef Francis Bazin, whose CV includes the Hilton, Brussels as well as Speltz and Melusina in Luxembourg. The gym has a range of bikes, treadmills and weights, with a sauna, steam room and sun bed just next door. Non-residents are also welcome to come to eat and exercise. A local physiotherapist/masseuse is also on call. Opened on 28th May, the hotel took 20 months to build and is part of a German hotel group.
